

Class 5/6 - All white


Children will wear their costumes to the evening performance unless told otherwise by their class teacher.

A Planning Proposal to regulate weddings and events on rural land is on exhibition for a period of 6 weeks from 7 November 2018.

The Planning Proposal aims to amend Byron Local Environmental Plan (LEP) 2014. The proposal will provide an assessment mechanism for commercial function centres on land zoned RU2 Rural Landscape. The proposal also seeks to set out a range of controls that will ensure that such commercial function centres do not result in disturbance to adjoining land owners or adverse impacts on rural amenity, farming or areas of high environmental value.


You can note any specific instructions eg which sauce with order or allergies in the instruction box. The cut off for preorders is 3pm on Tuesday 13/11.
